

How to vote on Election Day:

Where to go, what to bring and more

Where do I find my polling location?

Election Day polling locations vary based on the address at which you are registered to vote.

Where do I find my sample ballot?

A sample ballot is a ballot that has all of the candidates and measures for you to view before you vote.

Where do I find out of state voter information?

Students may choose to vote in their own state.

What do I need to bring when I vote?

Valid photo ID is required for in-person voting in Ohio. You can use any of the following:

- Ohio driver's license or state of Ohio ID card
- Interim ID form issued by the Ohio BMV
- A U.S. passport or U.S. passport card
- U.S. military ID, Ohio National Guard ID or U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs ID card

If you plan to vote absentee, the required voter ID options are different. You can use any of the following:

- Last four digits of your Social Security number
- Ohio driver's license or state of Ohio ID card
- A copy of a valid photo ID acceptable for in-person voting

What is a provisional ballot?

A provisional ballot is a ballot that one can cast when a voter would not otherwise be able to vote at their polling location. You may have to fill out a provisional ballot if you did not bring valid voter identification or if you changed your address and did not update your voter registration.
